We would also like to welcome Mrs Christine Langton and Miss Amelia Pickles to our After School Club team.



Attendance is compulsory from Reception.




Spring Term – The PTA will host a community café


We have been informed by Flintshire County Council that they will be increasing the cost of meals to £2.80 per day from the 2nd October 2023. This only affects years 5 & 6.
